

Measures taken so far at the Princess Day Care Centre:

- Multiple renovations of the playground
- Renovation of classrooms and medical room
- Renovation of the kitchen and equipment
- Food for the children
- Creation of a community garden
- Construction of new toilets with a budget of approximately 10,000 euros



Princess Day Care Center

After the classrooms at the Princess Day Care Centre were recently refurbished and there were problems with the old toilets, we decided to build new ones, which will then be connected to the city's sewage system. Due to bad weather, construction was delayed somewhat, and we were also somewhat limited in our choice of location due to the connection.

But now, as you can see on Facebook, the toilets have been handed over and are replacing the portable toilets that served as a temporary solution but also cost

additional money. The number of children cared for in this extremely difficult environment has risen from around 50 to over 70 in recent months. The Princess Day Care Centre is surrounded by a so-called squatter camp, where most of the dwellings consist of a few planks and plastic bags. The city has now started to create at least some access points for water and electricity. If everything goes according to plan, the area will at least develop into a neighbourhood with water, electricity and permanent dwellings.

Waldkicker League was a great success

50 U7 to U10 teams from Germany not only played football but also collected points with various environmental and other sustainability initiatives (3,500 in total). GUFC was a partner and, after the charity match on 16 August, we drew the last prize for the participants in the donation campaign Carmen Höfflin. CP Nationalteam #inclusion - Germany

The national team for footballers with cerebral palsy, which we support, was just performing excellently at the European Championships in England. After losing to the Netherlands, winning against Scotland and drawing against Ireland, they reached the semi-finals, which they lost to Ukraine. While the CP players have to fight to be promoted and funded as parasports athletes at all, teams such as Ukraine receive very high subsidies. Most of the athletes are paid professionals.

Thanks to the mediation of our advisory board member Bernhard Heinisch, we played a charity match on 16 August at SV Inter Bergsteig Amberg as part of the 200th anniversary celebrations of Sparkasse Amberg-Sulzbach. A great setting with lots of activities thrilled the kids and the spectators saw a lively game in which our team prevailed against a local selection coached by Lutz Ernemann with a score of 7:1. Impressive moves and a wonderful third half ensured that, in addition to the donation proceeds of 7,500 euros, there were satisfied faces on all sides. 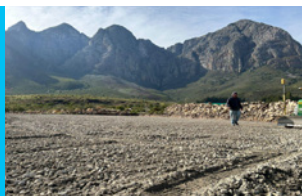

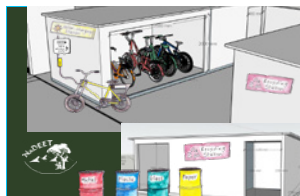
Winelands multi-sports field
